In Spanish, there are four ways to say "the"—el, la, los, las. The definite article (the) agrees with its noun in gender (masculine or feminine) and number (singular or plural).

Masculine singular nouns go with el. Feminine singular nouns go with la.

Examples: el libro (the book) el papel (the paper)
la silla (the chair) la regla (the ruler)



Masculine plural nouns go with los. Feminine plural nouns go with las.

Examples: los libros (the books) los papeles (the papers)
las sillas (the chairs) las reglas (the rulers)
