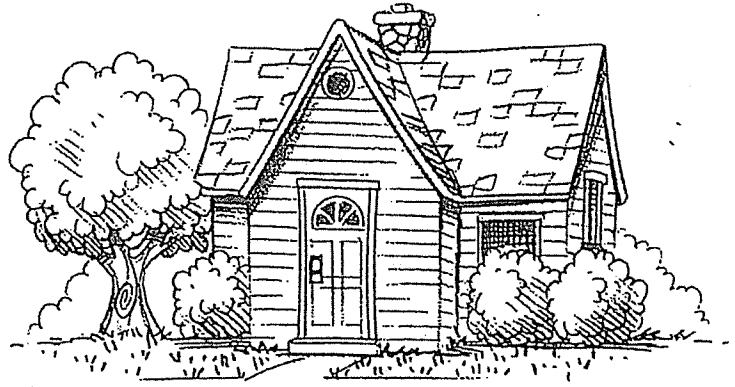
*mi*—my
