Possessive Adjectives

**Mi casa es  
su casa**

Spanish uses adjectives to show possession or to whom something belongs.

*mi*—my

*tu*—your (informal)

*su*—your (formal), his, her, their

*nuestro*—our (masculine)

*nuestra*—our (feminine)



The famous expression, *mi casa es su casa*, is a good example.

It means my house is your house
