







Pepper makes an altar in her house for the souls of the departed. She decorates it with <u>ofrendas</u> (offerings) of their favorite things.



Las ofrendas - offerings of food, drinks, photos and favorite possessions placed on altars for those who have died.

La flor de muertos - flower of the dead. It is a marigold and symbolic of life after death.
